A reading from the prophet Habakkuk.

How long, Lord, am I to cry for help
while you will not listen;
to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear
and you will not save?
Why do you set injustice before me,
why do you look on where there is tyranny?
Outrage and violence, this is all I see,
all is contention, and discord flourishes.
Then the Lord answered and said,
'Write the vision down,
inscribe it on tablets
to be easily read,
since this vision is for its own time only:
eager for its own fulfilment, it does not deceive;
if it comes slowly, wait,
for come it will, without fail.
See how he flags, he whose soul is not at rights,

I am reminding you to fan into a flame the gift that God gave you when I laid my hands on you. God's gift was not a spirit of timidity, but the Spirit of power, and love, and self-control. So you are never to be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord, or ashamed of me for being his prisoner; but with me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God. Keep as your pattern the sound teaching you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. You have been trusted to look after something precious; guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

The word of the Lord stands for ever;
it is the word given to you, the Good News.

Gospel [Lk 17:5-10](#)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.' The Lord replied, 'Were your faith the size of a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you. 'Which of you, with a servant ploughing or minding sheep, would say to him when he returned from the fields, "Come and have your meal immediately"? Would he not be more likely to say, "Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards"? Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty."'

From the Parish Priest


This week just past included our parish feast day and so the 30 or so people who come to daily mass at St Michael's completed a novena to St Michael. The cards with the novena prayer are in the foyer of the church, as are also the prayer to St Michael written by Pope Leo XIII at the end of the nineteenth century. That prayer he commanded the whole church to pray at the end of Sunday Mass and the practice continued until the liturgical reform of the Second Vatican Council. Given the terrible history of the Twentieth Century, one can see why he might have been inspired to order the prayer to St Michael whose task appointed by God is to fight against the evil spirit.

Many have suggested that we re-adopt this practice of praying to St Michael at the end of mass in our parish and I agree that this seems like a pretty good idea. I think we have more and more reason to be worried about the threat of a more widespread war spilling over from Russia's action in Eastern Europe, not to mention the other evils that trouble our world. Let us then take up the prayer to St Michael once again in our parish at the end of mass as we did once for 7 or 8 decades over a century ago.

October is the month of the Rosary and I would encourage all of you, especially those with children, to take up the Rosary, at least to pray a decade with your kids each night of October before bed. On this page you will see an advertisement for the growing phenomenon of men coming together on the first Saturday of the month to pray the Rosary at St Mary's Cathedral forecourt. This time it will be on the second Saturday, October 8, the day after the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

Lastly, to give you notice now, **Fr Sam will be taking annual leave** from the evening of Sunday 16 October until the morning of Saturday 29 October. During that time, weekday mass and adoration will not take place at St Michaels. For daily mass, please go to Greenwich Chapel at 8.30am.


