2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C

As we move now out of the season of Christmas we enter into what we know as Ordinary Time. When we think of 'Ordinary Time,' it doesn't mean: 'that old time again.' It doesn't mean the usual, the normal, the standard, or the typical. Rather, Ordinary Time refers to order. It refers to ordered time. Each week of Ordinary Time is numbered and the Church selects Gospel readings that largely (though not always) follow a chronological progression of the life of Jesus. Ordinary Time brings a sense of movement, a sense of pilgrimage, and sense that we are journeying and going somewhere.

This week's Gospel is still carrying with it a sense of the Feast of the Epiphany... An epiphany being a revelation, and this week Jesus is *revealing* his divine power by working his first miracle. Next week however, we begin with the first chapter of Luke's Gospel and begin an *ordered* progression through it.

First Reading (Isaiah 62:1-5)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

About Zion I will not be silent, about Jerusalem I will not grow weary, until her integrity shines out like the dawn and her salvation flames like a torch. The nations then will see your integrity, all the kings your glory, and you will be called by a new name, one which the mouth of the Lord will confer. You are to be a crown of splendour in the hand of the Lord, a princely diadem in the hand of your God; no longer are you to be named 'Forsaken', nor your land 'Abandoned', but you shall be called 'My Delight' and your land 'The Wedded'; for the Lord takes delight in you and your land will have its wedding.

Like a young man marrying a virgin, so will the one who built you wed you, and as the bridegroom rejoices in his bride, so will your God rejoice in you.

Gospel (Lk 2:41-52)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Every year the parents of Jesus used to go to Jerusalem for the feast of the Passover. When he was twelve years old, they went up for the feast as usual. When they were on their way home after the feast, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem without his parents knowing it. They assumed he was with the caravan, and it was only after a day's journey that they went to look for him among their relations and acquaintances. When they failed to find him they went back to Jerusalem looking for him everywhere.

Three days later, they found him in the Temple, sitting among the doctors, listening to them, and asking them questions; and all those who heard him were astounded at his intelligence and his replies. They were overcome when they saw him, and his mother said to him, 'My child, why have you done this to us? See how worried your father and I have been, looking for you.' 'Why were you looking for me?' he replied. 'Did you not know that I must be busy with my Father's affairs?' But they did not understand what he meant.

He then went down with them and came to Nazareth and lived under their authority. His mother stored up all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom, in stature, and in favour with God and men.
